

# **Conclusions:**

The groups of population served by the most organizations:

Sports and Recreation Youth Aged 0 - 9 Years Old Youth Aged 10 - 18 Years Old

#### The largest gaps of service are:

Mental Health Counselling or Social Services Immigration and New Comer Support

#### Staff and Volunteers:

Most organizations have very few to no paid staff, requiring them to rely heavily on volunteers.

#### Service by Geographical area:

The different geographical areas seem to be well served, especially in relation to population.

### **Recommendations:**

Over 50% of the organizations operate purely on volunteer manpower, indicating a need for more funding to be provided for hiring staff. This could decrease the workload volunteers must meet for their groups to be successful, preventing burn out.

Synergy has been steadily increasing their wellness programming which may address the gaps indicated in this survey. We recommend this trend continue and that community organizations continue to increase programming and supports to help fill these gaps.

Community collaboration with immigration service groups such as Rocky View Immigration Services may address the lack of immigration services.

Synergy intends to host and support workshops based on the top five requested subjects. Synergy will also disseminate important information to organizations regarding workshops and training in our area, Calgary and Alberta through our Community Newsletter.
